WMFC Hosts 100th Birthday Party for the Kiwanis Club of Midland

Does one sing Happy Birthday to a club? Maybe not. However, celebration is certainly in order when that club has its 100th year to commemorate, so that happened. On July 25, 2021 West Midland Family Center (WMFC) played host as the venerable Kiwanis Club of Midland (KCM) celebrated its 100th anniversary. Upon its establishment in July of 1921, Kiwanis Club of Midland was the 548th club to become part of Kiwanis International. Now in 2021, the Kiwanis Club of Midland is still going strong and making a difference in our community.

The organization's focus is on improving the quality of life in the community with an emphasis on the children. That

legacy is evident in the club's investments in *Camp Neyati*, *Midland High School Key Club*, *Northwood University Circle K*, mini-grants to elementary schools in *Midland County*, *Playground Builders* and WMFC early childhood programs.

In honor of KCM's contributions to WMFC, the evening began with a tour of WMFC's most recent addition. The tour was provided to shine a light on the spaces that have benefitted through KCM's generosity. This included: preschool classrooms, the two-lane bowling ally and multi-purpose rooms. The KCM has donated children's raincoats and boots, playground equipment and has funded preschool scholarships since

2012. All are integral to children's wellbeing and enhance the possibility child success. According to Greg Dorrien, WMFC Executive Director, "Time spent outside is an important feature of learning, so regardless of weather, we strive to get children outdoors daily. Without the rain gear donated by KCM there are definitely children who would not have appropriate outerwear to join in the

WMFC Aquatic Staff Celebrates Record Breaking 21st Summer

Much to the delight of *West Midland Family Center (WMFC)* families, after being closed in 2020 because of the pandemic, the WMFC swimming pool was open for business this summer providing expanded hours for open swim sessions. As a result, the WMFC pool surpassed all open swim attendance numbers of previously summers.

"It was a successful summer on many fronts," shared *Renee Allen*, *WMFC Aquatic Director*. "After a summer of no pool it was great news to the community and our aquatic staff when we got the green light to open the pool this summer. As aquatic facilities across the country struggled to find lifeguards because of a 2-year nationwide lifeguard shortage, WMFC was pleased to return our entire staff from 2019," continued Allen. "Our aquatic staff is fully committed to WMFC and the families in our community.

"Our maintenance staff got a heads up and preordered our chlorine in January. This allowed us to remain open when facilities across the United States were either having to close, or having to limit their hours, as a result of a nationwide chlorine shortage," shared Allen. "In addition to breaking attendance records, we also completed our 21st summer of ZERO life-threatening emergencies at the pool. That stat is the result of our vigilant lifeguard staff who takes safety seriously and enforces our pool rules to keep everyone safe. I would be surprised if any aquatic facility in the country can match that statistic. All said. we had a very successful summer," concluded Allen.

In a new twist this summer, the WMFC Aquatic Staff held a weekly prize drawing for visiting swimmers. Every time a swimmer came to the pool they were given a Swim to Win Prize Drawing Entry Blank to complete and drop into the magic fish bowl, located at the WMFC Welcome Center. Three prize winners were chosen each week.

Later in the summer when COVID restrictions lifted making it safe to do so, the aquatic staff hosted a few special events. In July and August the WMFC Preschool Department hosted free swim nights for families preschoolers to showcase WMFC's highly successful preschool program. Families of preschoolers were given free admission into the pool and lawn games were set up on the pool deck. Missy Finney, WMFC Preschool Enrollment Specialist, was on hand to answer questions and share information on WMFC preschool offerings. As families left the event, they were given prize bags, snacks and drinks. The August preschool event broke a record for the most swimmers at the pool for any one day during the summer of 2021!

On August 11, 2021 WMFC kicked off the first WMFC Recreation Family Night of the year by hosting a party at the pool. Families swam, played lawn games and took part in prize drawings. WMFC Lifeguards grilled up hotdogs and burgers to add to an incredible buffet filled with delicious foods that fed all in attendance. 
"Mia still talks about Ms. Julie and all she learned," continued Jazalyn.

"My kids all benefited from WMFC preschool, they love school and I think that's in part because they began their schooling at WMFC."

Jazalyn has seen valuable behavioral changes in her children as a result attending WMFC Preschool, "They know how calm themselves. They have learned to get a book, sit quietly in a corner and do relaxation breathing. Our home is much calmer now. The only type of yelling you hear, is when the kids are

hollering because they are having fun," continued Jazalyn. "In Parent Education, I learned my children's love languages and that children's learning develops in stages. Their emotions speak to their needs." This summer, the Sanders family had a blast at WMFC's Family Camp Nevati

"My husband works from sun-up to sun-down so he misses occasions to be with the kids. Being at camp was wonderful for our family. Paul had time to play with and enjoy the kids. I saw his heart just melt with happiness. This has prompted Paul to take every opportunity to engage with the children. Now when he gets home from work, if the children are still up, he runs around playing with them. They have so much fun, laughing and laughing," concluded Jazalyn. "We will definitely participate in WMFC programs as long as we can. I want to continue being a part of this community and encourage everyone else to do the same!"
