Immunizations Up To Date at WMFC

The measles outbreak that has caught the nation's attention caused WMFC staff members to take a precautionary second look at the vaccination rate of the children attending our own preschool. Then we went back to work

on more serious problems. WMFC serves 124, three and four-year-old children in the Center's various preschool programs. We're pleased to report that 123 of the 124 children are current in their vaccinations. Only one family has chosen to opt out by claiming a philosophical exemption. As a result, this one child is certainly safer at WMFC than at Disneyland (ground zero for the measles outbreak), or just about anywhere else the family may travel.

in changes in the childcare classrooms. Softer baskets in the infant rooms, more pictures of families throughout the childcare wing and changes in room colors and furniture choices, have contributed to an overall "homey" feeling in the classrooms. All of these changes provide for a positive environment for children to learn and grow.

STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) practices are also being integrated into the children's learning experience. As an example, because of their interest in animals, WMFC preschool children recently learned about bears and hibernation and what happens to bears during the winter months. The children studied what bears eat, where they sleep and how long their nails are. They also had a once in a life time experience of touching a real bear when one of the childcare staff members secured a full body mount of a grizzly bear for the children to study and touch and feel. The children even had a visit from a "bear," during snack time when a teen volunteer dressed up as "Mr. Bear" to share a snack with them. "Mr. Bear" and the children ate the types of berries that were like those that real bears might eat in the wild.

Children in the childcare program have always been rather partial to the idea of bears at WMFC. Some time ago each childcare classroom was given a "bear" name. The infants became the "Cubs", the toddlers became the "Teddy Bears" and the preschoolers are now the "Brown Bears".

Bears are also a WMFC Playground theme and part of an exciting upcoming playground expansion. "Grizz-Lee Bear", a play structure, which has been funded by a grant from the Midland Kiwanis Foundation will be added to the playground this summer. With all the bear changes and additions, bears of all kinds will most likely have a long endearing relationship with WMFC children for many years to come!
